Ruckus & Glee: A place for children of all ages

Matthew Poulson is busy fashioning a gift bag out of a flat sheet of polka-dot wrapping paper. Children of all ages drift about, trying out different toys and projects. It's a typical Wednesday afternoon at Ruckus & Glee, a unique toy store that opened last September at the corner of 68th and Cedar St.

Ruckus & Glee was the brainstorm of Poulson and his wife Sarah Fowles. When their daughter Elinor, now 10, wished that there was more to do for kids in their Tosa neighborhood along North Avenue, they decided to open a toy store based upon her love of toys. Ruckus & Glee was born; the first store was located on North Avenue. In just a year and a half, they outgrew their store on North and relocated to 68th Street.

Ruckus & Glee is what you'd call an atypical toy store, featuring thoughtful, unusual toys not found in many standard stores. Poulson and Fowles are quick to point out that the items on their shelves are not educational toys, but rather toys chosen to inspire

and prompt creativity and exploration. That's why most toys are displayed to encourage customers to experience them firsthand.

The name Ruckus & Glee is a play on a law firm (Fowles has a law degree and works as a senior human resources consultant for a major bank). Ruckus is the name of their neighbor's dog, and Poulson says Glee captures the thrill of playing.

Future plans for the store include the creation of cartoon characters named Ruckus and Glee in an early comic book style. Right now the day to day store operations are keeping its owners busy, and happily so. In a rare quiet moment, Poulson brings out a helicopter contraption, flying it around the store. From his impish smile it's obvious he loves playing with the toys as much as anybody.

Ruckus and Glee is located at 805 N. 68th Street next door to Simma's Bakery, and is open from 10-6 Tuesdays through Saturday, and from 12-4 on Sundays.

Back to Life: Arts & Crafts home gets a loving makeover



As we pulled up to the seemingly lackluster 1906 Arts and Crafts structure, set back on the large, corner lot of the bustling coffeeshop neighborhood, we both had some reservations. But as soon as we set foot inside the dwelling, we knew this was going to be a good one. When it comes to homes, my husband and I (luckily) agree on two major things: We have an admiration for historical structures – we just love figuring out the house's story – and we don't mind putting in hard work to restore a home to its rightful state. Each room we entered, it had our wheels turning in ways we've never experienced. It was intriguing. It was mysterious. It was... perfect. All of its quirks. All of its cracks. All of its pickled woodwork. It had to be ours.

We were committed to bringing this house back to its original life. We wanted to this house the justice it deserved; justice that would put a smile on the face of the original builder.

Since 2013, we've been lucky enough to learn more about our house and neighborhood from our amazing neighbors, in particular, Myron McCormack, who lived in the house across the street as a toddler since 1942.

She shared handfuls of charming stories, explaining how her family offered their bedrooms to house engineers working on

Additionally, she mentioned the numerous fundraisers her family hosted, her father's countless hours of work he put in the house, and the fondest of family memories that were given new life by the work we've completed. She said her parents would have been thrilled!

This not only sparked a renewed interest in our home's history, but in the history of the Jacobus Park neighborhood in general. Once you start looking for it, history can be seen all around us. From the turn-of-the-century architectural styles rendered by large profile architects to the removal of the century-old trolley tracks along Wells St., dating back



I'M HERE TO FUEL RUMORS AND EXCITEMENT flying around regarding a potential bridge over Menomonee River near Jacobus Park. I have it on good authority that an Advisory Committee has formed and established strong community support from neighborhoods and businesses on the north and south sides of the river. The committee has interested members from Quarry Heights, Jacobus Park, MMSD, Hawthorn Glen and Hawley Environmental MPS, and Milwaukee County Parks. There have been several discussions with city, local businesses, and county officials sharing the widespread support for this venture.

We're in discussions on multiple fronts to creatively finance this endeavor. We believe this project addresses mutually beneficial interests with the city, county and MMSD. Given the positive response from all stakeholders, we're confident collaborative financing for this is a viable and likely solution. McKinley's Miracle: A Life-Changing Treatment Brings Hope to a Jacobus Park Family

For one family in the Charles Jacobus Park neighborhood, 2018 may be the year their daughter sees for the first time, thanks gene therapy that received FDA approval late last year.

It was in the first few weeks of McKinley Sovey's life that her parents Julie and Parker noticed something strange about her eyes. They would shake whenever she tried to focus, she would have difficulties tracking, and they noticed a lack of eye contact. After countless referrals and tests, their fears were confirmed that McKinley's retinal response was flat, and that she was indeed blind, able only to see bright light, but no detail. The formal diagnosis was Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA), a rare inherited retinal disease affecting only a few thousand people in the United States. People with LCA are generally born with very limited vision that almost always progresses to total blindness.

Once the extent of McKinley's visual impairment was known, she began a rigorous therapy program at Vision Forward on Hawley Road. At that point, there was no known cure for LCA, but in December 2017, McKinley and her family received what they call a Christmas miracle: The FDA had approved the nation's first gene therapy for an inherited disease—the first ever treatment of its kind, and one that happened to be an exact match for McKinley's diagnosis.

The gene therapy called Luxturna (created by Spark Therapeutics) is an injection given directly to patients' eyes to replace the defective gene. Patients who received the treatment have described seeing snow, stars, the moon and even their parent's faces for the first time. It's an incredible gift, but it comes with a price tag of \$850,000.

What's more, the treatment is not offered locally. Instead, the Sovays will travel to the University of Iowa's Carver College of Medicine for the procedure (they visited the facility in March, meeting with lead researcher Dr. Stephen Russell, who recommended scheduling the treatment for later this year).
