



The Need for Purpose and the Need for Validation

This article is a reprint of a blog posted by Adele Lund, Laureate Group's Director of Community and Business Relations for Laureate Group, which operates eight senior communities throughout the Greater Milwaukee area including Hart Park Square in Wauwatosa.

One of the more meaningful aspects of my role with Laureate Group is guiding families through unfamiliar circumstances, specifically related to long term care and their loved one. As a part of that, I often find myself sitting in a client's living room facilitating a conversation between parents and adult children. I had such an experience just recently.

It began as a phone conversation with the daughter of an elderly couple in their 90's. Dad has been trying to care for mom, but it's begun to adversely impact his own health. The family wants mom and dad to move to a senior community, but dad is resistant. When I asked what's holding him back, she indicated he's become stubborn and that has hindered their ability to have productive conversations on the subject. I asked if "stubborn" was a word they would have used to describe him for many years, or was it something new. It was new. That instantly suggested to me that he was likely struggling with something tied to his current circumstances. I offered to meet with her parents and family and see if we couldn't dig a little deeper into her dad's thoughts. It's hard to have a productive conversation when you don't know what's really on their mind.

Despite being prepared to address a "stubborn" man, I found a kind and caring soul who was overwhelmed by losses he'd faced in recent years. He could no longer drive. He used to be pretty social in his career but now found himself seeing few people each day. He'd also recently realized that he was constantly asking his family to do things for him, which is not something he was overly comfortable with. It was less about being a burden and more about feeling the loss of purpose. What was left for him when there was so much he couldn't do?

After he took me on a journey of his childhood exploits, his adult career, and his retirement, I took the opportunity to validate the many contributions he's made in his life. It wasn't until his life had been validated that we could begin to talk about the next phase of that life. We discussed the need to look forward, to consider the senior community he and his family had explored. It was important to acknowledge that there are things he can no longer do, but instead of dwelling solely upon the losses, he had to honestly consider the things he can do. He needed a little help to see that. For example, he has a magical smile that could warm the heart of anyone in his presence. He can converse with people who are lonely and would enjoy listening to his stories. And that's just the tip of the iceberg of valuable contributions he has to offer.

As we concluded our conversation, he graciously gifted me a couple toys for my grandkids. Not just any toys, but ones that he made with his own hands. Like I said..just the tip of the iceberg. ■

Modeled after the event Wilson/WSTEM School pioneered in 2017, students in each grade worked with a local organization to learn about community needs in the Milwaukee area and how they could help. The students, staff, and over 40 volunteers worked on three projects supporting The Gathering, two projects with the Hart Park Senior Center, two projects for The Milwaukee Rescue Mission, a project for Kathy's House, and one for Feeding America. What was accomplished in one morning was amazing!

- 200 placemats decorated for The Gathering's holiday meal
- 167 bagged lunches made and assembled for The Gathering
- 150 scarves made for The Milwaukee Rescue Mission
- 21 blankets made for Kathy's House
- 27,642 pounds of food sorted and boxed at Feeding America
- 226 cans of soup collected for Feeding America
- 75 pairs of gloves collected for The Gathering
- 278 pairs of pants + 131 pajamas collected for The Milwaukee Rescue Mission totaling 145 pounds
- Many songs sung, snacks eaten, Gratitude Tree created with seniors at Hart Park

Seeing the World for the First Time

Innovative therapy offers the gift of sight to local toddler

Last year we told you about McKinley Sovey, a CJPNA girl who has Leber Congenital Amaurosis, specifically a mutation of the RPE 65 gene. She was born with it and doctors said it's so rare that only about 2,000 of people have it in the country. In the months that followed, McKinley and her family pursued groundbreaking treatment in Iowa. Here, McKinley's mom Julie provides an update on the outcome of the surgery and therapy.


In November McKinley underwent two successful gene therapy surgeries at the University of Iowa Children's Hospital. The surgeries consisted of delivering a healthy copy of the RPE65 gene directly to each eye, behind the retina.

Shortly after the second surgery we got proof that the procedure was successful, McKinley made eye contact with us for the

first time! I can only compare it to that first time your baby locks eyes with you after birth, just three years in the making.

McKinley is truly seeing the world for the first time since surgery. She is noticing and seeking out objects further away from her, including locating the string hanging from a helium balloon. She is now able to feed herself visually when before she would have to use the "touch and feel" method, which was messy. We were so excited to be able to see her eat a yogurt and actually look and see where the cup was and aim the spoon appropriately.

She is much more confident navigating her space and is doing a lot less bumping into things and tripping these days. One of the biggest changes and a sight that still takes our breath away, is McKinley can now enjoy watching TV and an IPAD. We love watching



her be able to enjoy some of the same things that a typical three year old does.

Thank you so much to all of our Jacobus Park Neighbors for supporting McKinley and our family through this journey! ■





Rose's - A Family Tradition Since 1949

Rose's Flower Shop, on the corner of 68th Street and Wells Street, is the featured CJPNA business member for this newsletter.

Rose's opened in Wauwatosa in 1949, named for its original owner, Rose Zorich (pictured on the left). The first Rose's was located at 826 North 68th, the current site of the Milwaukee T-Shirt Co. As the business grew, it moved into 820 North 68th Street, which is now the home of Ultimate Confections. In 1971, the corner spot opened up on 68th and Wells, and the business settled in there.

Rose was married to another well-known businessman, Sam Zorich, who owned the very popular Knotty Pine Tavern on State (formerly on the corner of 70th Street, now occupied by the Outpost parking lot).

After Rose passed away in 2001, her nephew Phil and his wife Monique Krainz

carried on the family flower tradition. Rose had previously been in business with Phil's Dad, Lee, from 1950 through the year of her passing. For nearly two decades now, Phil and Monique--along with dogs Smokey, who passed away in 2010, and current canine Lilly--have been welcoming flower shoppers to the store. Monique is a past member of the CJPNA Board of Directors.

Visitors to Rose's are also treated to an impressive display of flower options as well as seasonal décor. You can view Phil's amazing collection of lunch boxes, which line the upper shelves of the shop and date back to the 50s. In addition, Rose's is currently featuring a variety of "old timey" clocks that the Krainz's recently acquired, as well as vintage pictures of the original businesses on the corner of 68th and Wells. ■



If they can arrive before our deployed ambulance and begin CPR and AED shock, they can save a life.

If a Project Lifesaver client is missing, caregivers call 911 immediately, and trained search specialists arrive on site with locating equipment. Under this program, recovery times may decrease dramatically over traditional search and rescue techniques.
